Storm Surge Watch vs Warning

Storm Surge Warning

There is a danger of life-threatening inundation from rising water moving inland from the shoreline generally within 36 hours.

Promptly follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials.

Storm Surge Watch

There is a **possibility of life- threatening inundation** from rising water moving inland from the shoreline generally **within 48 hours**.

Promptly follow evacuation and other instructions from local officials.

Hurricane Threats and Alerts

Wind

Hurricane Watch: Hurricane force winds (74mph) are possible in 48 hours

Hurricane Warning: Hurricane force winds are expected in 36 hours

Extreme Wind Warning: Sustained winds of 115mph are imminent or happening, shelter in a study location

Storm Surge

Watch: Possibility of life-threatening inundation within 48 hours

Danger of life-threatening inundation within 36 hours

Hurricane Threats and Alerts

Tornado

Watch:

The ingredients are present for a tornado to form.

Warning:

A Tornado is happening – take cover!

Flooding

Flood Advisory:

Be cautious, avoid ponded roads

Flood Watch:








Dangers of Extreme Wind and Wind Infiltration

Tornadoes in Hurricanes

Right Front Quadrant relative to storm motion is most likely to create tornadoes

Depending upon the storm, tornadoes may happen up to 100 miles away from the storm center.



Hurricane Watch Vs Warning




Indicates the possibility that you could experience hurricane conditions within 48 hours.

HURRICANE WARNING Indicates that sustained winds of at least 74 mph are expected within 36 hours.

2025 Forecasting Updates

- Upgraded to a 7-Day Tropical Weather Outlook
- Adding experimental inland tropical storm and hurricane watches and warnings
 - Will communicate inland wind risk

Ational Hurricane Center Aropical Cyclone Forecast Cone Graph




Cone of Uncertainty


66% chance the center of the eye will be inside the cone.

Impacts can and will occur outside of the cone.

The further out the forecast, the least accurate the forecast is.



Hurricane Rapid Intensificatio n

- Rapid Intensification occurs when winds in a tropical cyclone increase by approximately 35mph or more in a 24-hour period.
- Rapid intensification is becoming more common due to high water temperatures and lower wind sheer
- In the past 20 years, 8.1% or 49 storms rapidly intensified from a Category 1 to a major Category 3 or higher.



Flood Zone Vs. Evacuation Level

- Flood Zones
 - Created by FEMA to show areas of highand moderate- to low-flood risk
 - Used to determine flood insurance requirements
 - Just because you are not in a flood zone, that does not mean you will not flood due to a hurricane
 - You can be outside of a flood zone and still be evacuated

- Evacuation Levels
 - Determined by the County based on storm surge data from the National Hurricane Center
 - Indicates your risk of danger due to storm surge or winds
 - Evacuations are only called when there is a threat to life and property in your level.

FEMA Coastal Risk Flood Maps Effective March 27, 2024

Zone AE - High risk flood zone which is a special flood hazard area (SFHA) with a 1% annual chance of flooding (100-year flood). Base flooded elevation determined.


Zone X (Yellow) - Areas of 0.2% annual chance of flood; areas of 1% annual chance flood with average depths of less than one foot or with drainage areas less than one square mile.

Zone X (No Color) - Areas determined to be outside the 0.2% annual chance floodplain. THIS AREA HAS NO POP-UP INFORMATION

Hurricane Evacuation Centers: Lifeboat, Not a Cruise Ship

- Hurricane Evacuation Centers will be available, but they should be a last resort.
- Each person gets only 20 Square Feet of space in the evacuation center.
- 4 Evacuation Centers in the City (12 in the County)
 - Atwater Elementary School
 - Heron Creek Middle School
 - North Port High School
 - Woodland Middle School
 - *Taylor Ranch Elementary School



Medical Needs Program

Sarasota County runs the Medical Needs Program

Program is available for Sarasota County residents with qualifying medical needs and/or are electrically dependent.

Qualify for special Medical Needs Dependent Evacuation Center

Must bring a caregiver to the facility.

Transportation is available to assist with getting residents to the Evacuation Center

Evacuations: Mandatory or Not?

We will not force you from your home, however if you chose to stay, be aware of the following risks:

- No help is coming during the storm
- Emergency vehicles do not respond after sustained winds reach 45 mph or greater
- It could take days before help can get to you
- Your home may be without power and water for days or weeks
- Your vehicles may be flooded

When to evacuate



- Evacuations have been issued for your area
- The winds surpass the threshold your home was built to sustain
- You or someone in your home relies on electricity for survival
- You and your family's peace of mind

Preparing your Home/Business For Evacuation

Move any outdoor furniture and anything that could become airborne.

Trim back compromised or dangerous tree limbs.

Ensure carbon monoxide detectors are functioning.

Ensure all doors and windows are closed and locked.

Put up Hurricane Shutters. Shut off emergency water valve to prevent backup into the home.

Shut off main power breaker to prevent electrical fires.

Ensure Insurance Information is accessible

Preparing your Home to Shelter in Place

Everything from the Previous Slide Plus:

Clean bathtubs and fill with water

Stock up on drinking water and shelf stable food

Fuel up generators and cars

Get refills on all medications (for people and pets)

Charge electronic devices and portable chargers

Download movies and games

Ensure your neighbors, friends, and family know to check on you after the storm.

Get Cash from ATMs

Other Important Info

Get Cash from ATMs

Keep valuable paperwork safe (dishwasher in plastic bags)

Have insurance information on hand

Have important contacts written down

Ensure battery powered vehicles and devices are safe from floodwaters

Considerations for Pets

- Stock up on pet food, treats, water, and medications.
- Ensure you have up-to-date vaccination records.
- Have pet friendly hotels pre-identified.
- Bring a crate or carrier for your pet.
- Have your pet's favorite toys/blankets/bed.





Evacuation Re-entry

- Only areas that have been deemed safe will be reopened for residents to return to their homes.
- Stay informed to guidance from official sources on safe areas for reentry.
- Have two forms of identification with proof of residential or business ownership.
- Most importantly Be Patient!



CERT and the City of North Port

- Neighborhood CERTs in North Port may assist the City before and after a hurricane by:
 - Preparing their homes, and assisting their neighbors to prepare their homes
 - Maintaining a list of who is evacuating and who is staying
 - Providing critical information about their community to first responders
 - Informing the City of where the hardest-hit areas are
 - Having an organized approach for checking on their neighbors
 - Safely beginning light recovery operations within the scope of their training
 - Communicating unmet needs to the City
 - Assisting with points of distribution and staffing shelters
- CERT does not replace first responders
